At the Mae Ukho Viewpoint, you will enjoy a breathtaking panoramic view where you can see the meandering road with plenty of turns and curves along the golden Mexican sunflower fields, which is the uphill path you have climbed.

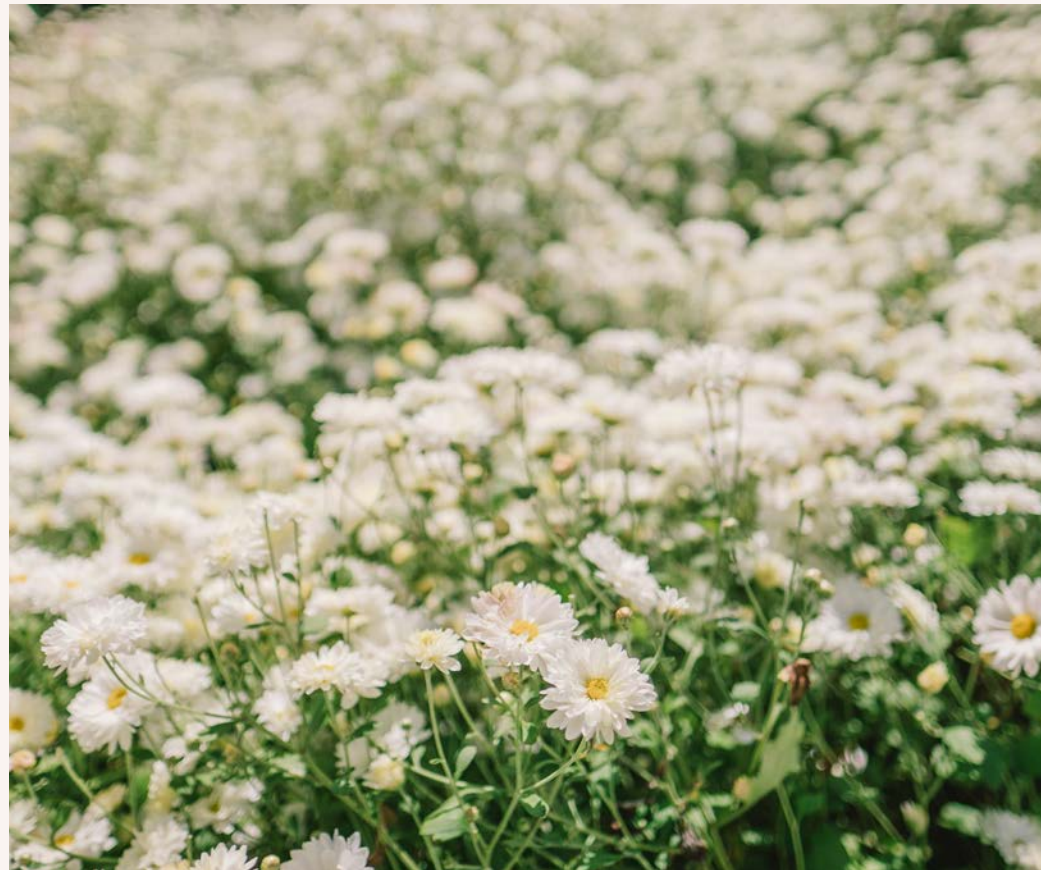

The decorative items, both wooden and textile objects, are the products resulting from the occupation of the owner, Siringam Yawirach. She made a part of her house into this lovely coffee shop that serves not only coffee, but also food and Thai desserts. The menu of each day is different, depending on the fresh ingredient available on that particular day. Inside the coffee shop, there are handmade crafts for sale, including clothes made from traditional textiles, such as, shirts, trousers, scarfs, and pillows. The place is usually visited by regular customers who come to shop, especially the Japanese.

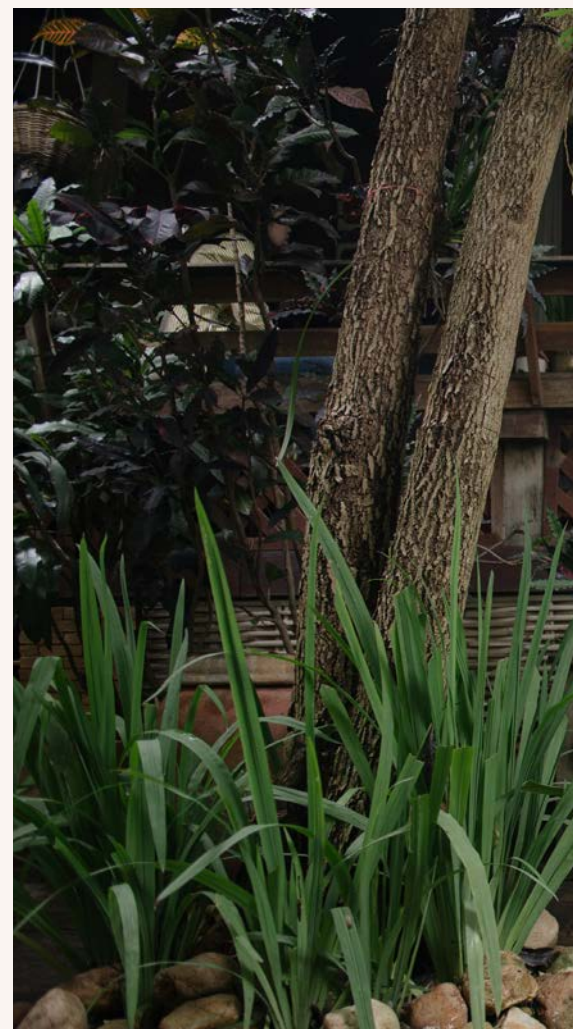

Ma Doo Bua Phuket



Ma Doo Bua is not a French word, but a Thai phrase that can be literally translated as “come and look at the water lilies.” It is a restaurant and cafe inside At Panta Hotel, a traditional Thai-style wooden house hotel built around the pond full of Victoria water lilies or giant water lilies. This is the largest kind of water lilies with a large rhizome underneath. When it is fully grown, a person can stand on its huge leaf because when this water lily grows to its full size, the leaf is able to support a large weight up to 80 kilogrammes. Come and stand on the water lily leaf, have fun with photos taking, and taste the signature dishes made of the stems of the Victoria water lily, such as, water lily stems boiled with coconut milk and mackerel, fresh water lily stems and shrimp dipping sauce, and water lily roots fried with salt. There are also desserts that contains water lily stems, such as, panna cotta, sweetened water lily stems, and a Thai sweet called Bua Loi.

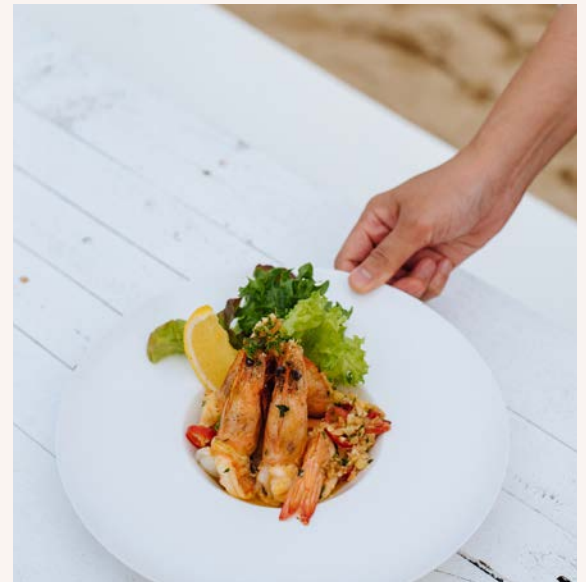

The Lake of Red Water Lilies Udon Thani



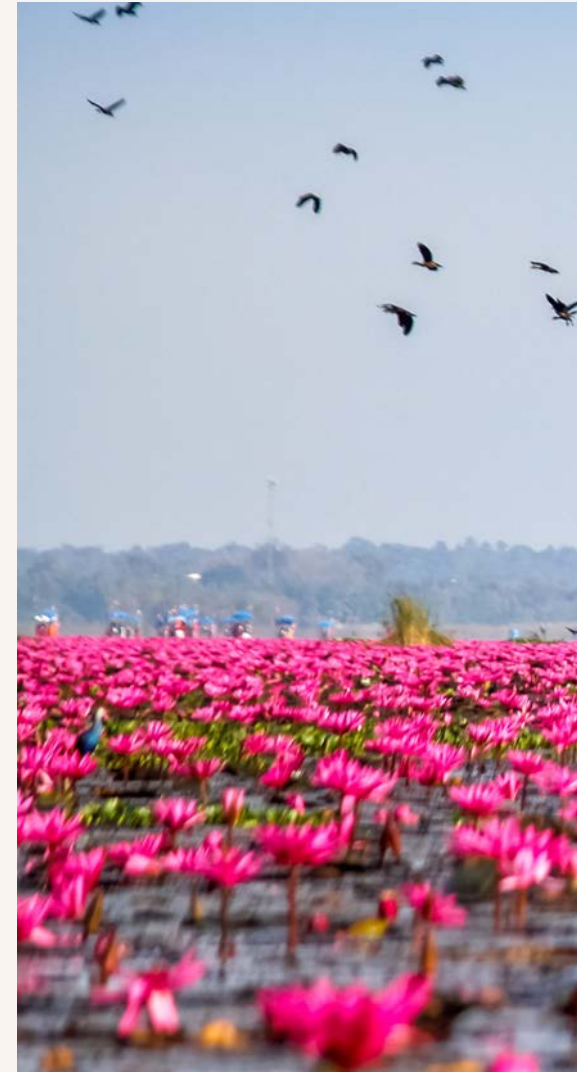
The Lake of Red Water Lilies – Early in the morning, the water lilies slowly spread out their petals to greet the sunlight, while herons and egrets are swooping down to the water to get some fish. This is Nong Han, the largest freshwater lake in Kumphawapi District, where an abundance of nature and ecological systems remain intact. The lake looks fascinating to the eyes with thousands of pinkish red water lilies covering the vast surface of the water, as if someone had covered it with a red carpet. Red water lilies or Bua Sai put forth their buds in October and gradually blossom until they are in full bloom during December to March. At the end of the year, the people of Ban Diem will collaboratively remove the aquatic weed from the lake so that the water lily flowers can rise above the water’s surface to welcome tourists with their beauty. There is a boat service taking tourists to see the water lilies for a 1.5-hour trip. The small boat can accommodate 2-3 people at 150 Baht per person. A large boat accommodates 6-10 people at 600 Baht per boat

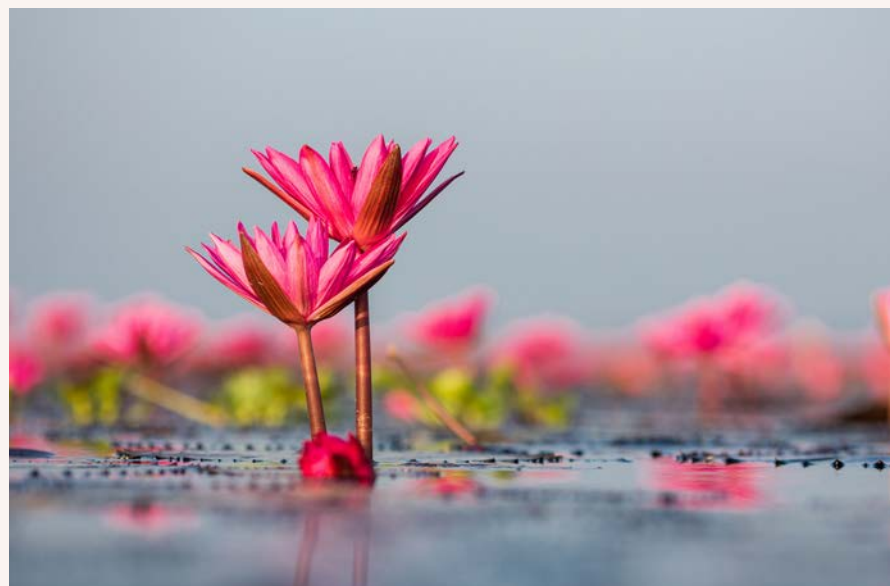

After The Rain Coffee & Gallery – When urbanization advances and spreads to all other areas, traditional orchards with canals that used to be the normal way of life of Thais become something rare and cool that everyone wants to experience once in a while. “After The Rain” is a small coffee place in a glasshouse with a few tables and simple decoration. The selling point that attracts most visitors is the outdoor zone connected to the canals of an orchard full of coconut palms, lime trees and areca palms. A yellow plastic boat is provided for guests to paddle through the canals and observe the life of the coconut plantation owners. Food and drink served in this coffee place are made from the main ingredients that are fresh materials from the local area such as sago palm, butterfly pea, and coconut.

Floral Cafe at Napasorn – This cafe inside a florist’s is richly scented with flowers, tea, coffee, and homemade bakery products. Napasorn is an old and well-known florist’s in Pak Khlong Talat area. The owner is Phuwanart Chumsricharin, one of the famous florists in Thailand. The ground floor is a flower shop while the second floor is a cafe. The whole place is exquisitely decorated with gorgeous details; such as, chandeliers, vintage furniture, stuffed animals, porcelain vases, as well as fresh and dried flowers. The sweetness of the flowers and the grandeur of the decorations and appliances produce a balance blending of design, surrounded by the rustic cement wall a cracked surface, exposing the bricks inside. The tea served here is the cafe’s unique blend of floral tea. Those who have a passion for decorative art can go up to the third floor where vintage items are put on sale. Some of them are the collection of the shop owner himself.

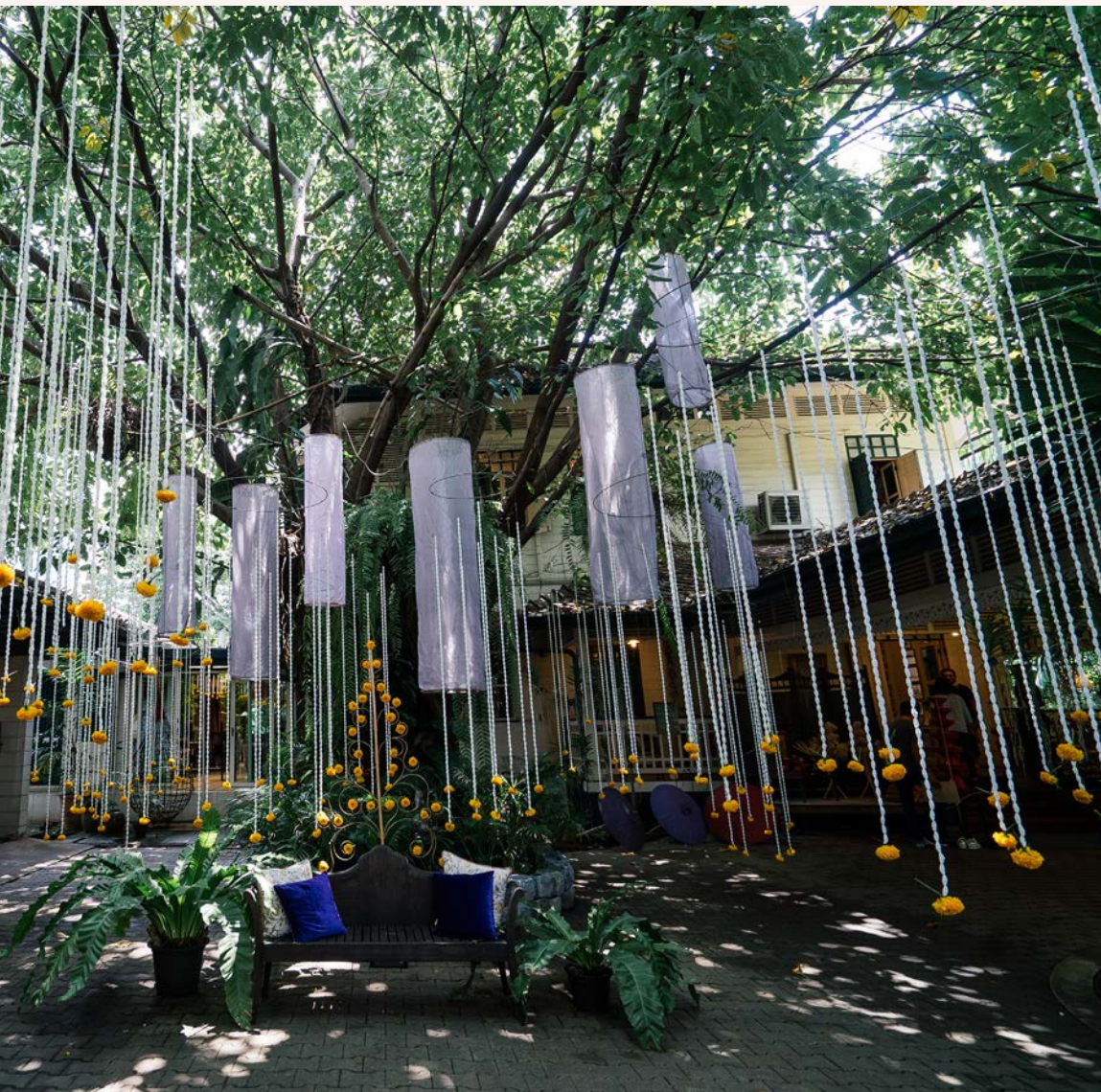

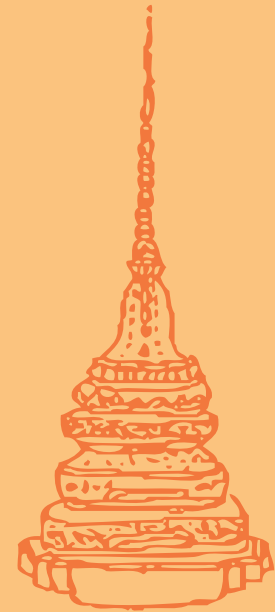

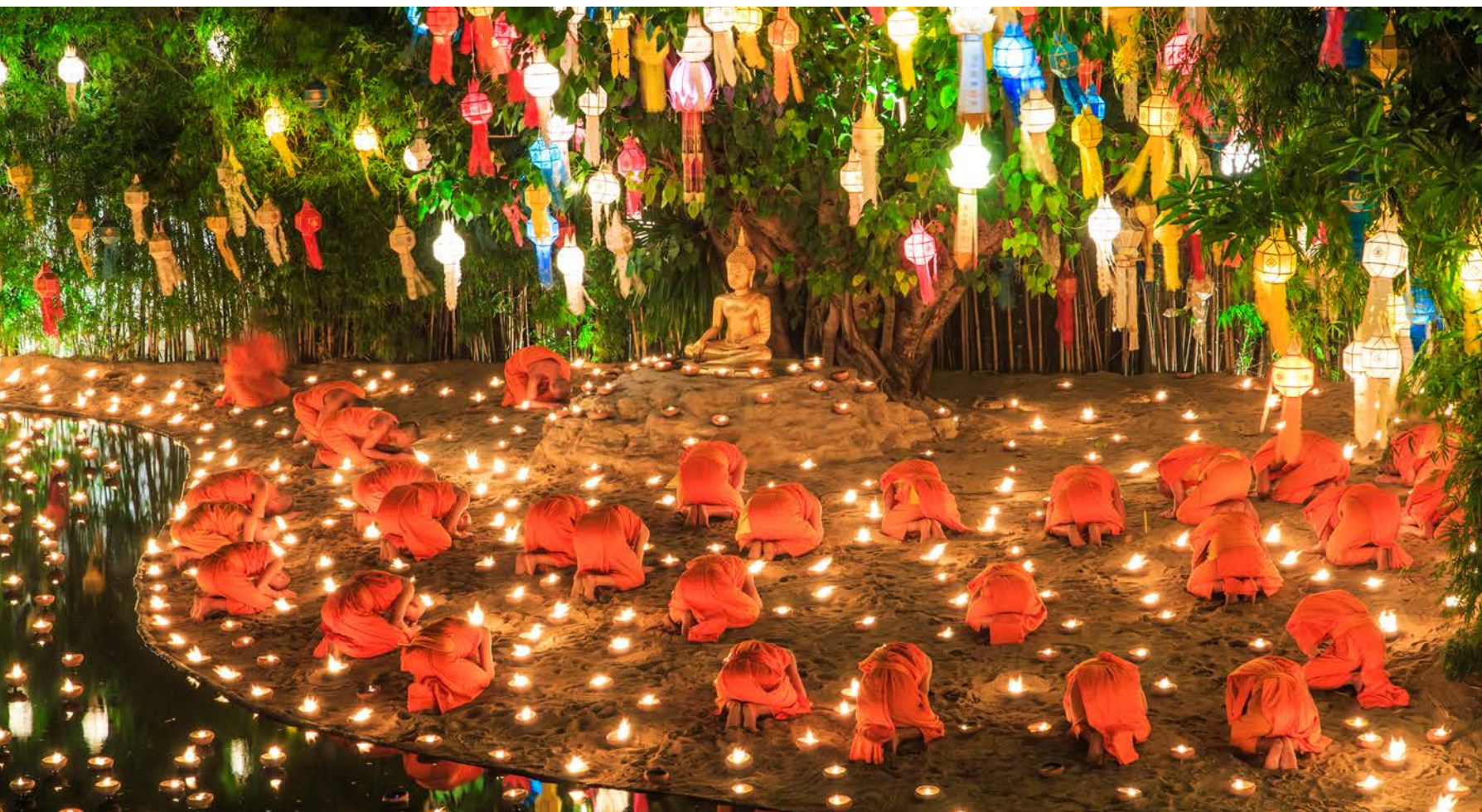

Wat Phan Tao is one of the oldest temples in Chiang Mai. Its outstanding building is Ho Kham Luang image hall, which is entirely made from teak. Over the main door facade is an attractive woodcarving depicting a peacock, the symbol of the Northern kingdom's rulers. It was formerly a throne hall of King Mahotaraprathet, the fifth ruler of Chiang Mai. Thereafter, the hall was dismantled and recycled into Ho Kham Luang by order of King Inthawichayanon, the seventh ruler. On important Buddhist days, the temple's candle lighting ceremonies will be held, making the whole area beautiful and glowing with hundreds of light over the courtyard and around the pond. The name of the temple "Phan Tao" (a thousand kilns) is a distortion of the word "Phan Thao" (a thousand times), whose meaning reflected the belief that when one made merit at this temple, they would receive a thousand times greater merit in return, and in the past, the temple's grounds contained a large number of kilns, which were used for constructing a standing Buddha image for Wat Chedi Luang. Since the Buddha statue was very large, so a thousand kilns were needed to complete the whole figure at once.

Wat Ton Kwen is a small old temple with a beautiful Lanna architectural style. Both the main hall and the four-porched pavilion perfectly preserve the Thai Lanna art and architecture even though the temple has been restored and renovated many times. In 1989, the Association of Siamese Architects officially announced the temple as an outstanding conservation building. The word "Ton Kwen" is the Northern language meaning Takhop tree or jam trees. The fact that during the construction in 1856, the temple's area contained a lot of Kwen trees, thus giving it the name. Thereafter, it was renamed Wat Inthrawat, but locals still call the temple by its old familiar name. The beauty of Wat Ton Kwen's main hall inspired the architects to create a classical design for the Royal Park Rajapruek grand pavilion.

Wat Umong (Suan Buddha Dhamma) is one of Chiang Mai's most important temples. Unlike other temples, this place is known for its beauty and uniqueness. The tunnel of the temple has brick walls and four entrances, which can be accessed from all directions. King Kuena ordered the tunnel built for Phra Thera Chan to be used as a meditation place. The arched ceiling of the tunnel contains very beautiful Buddhist murals that depict over 500-year-old paintings of lotus, peonies, and birds. The temple has peaceful natural surroundings. A forest and wild animals sanctuary is located behind the temple, and the forest itself has become one of Chiang Mai's famous places for bird watching.

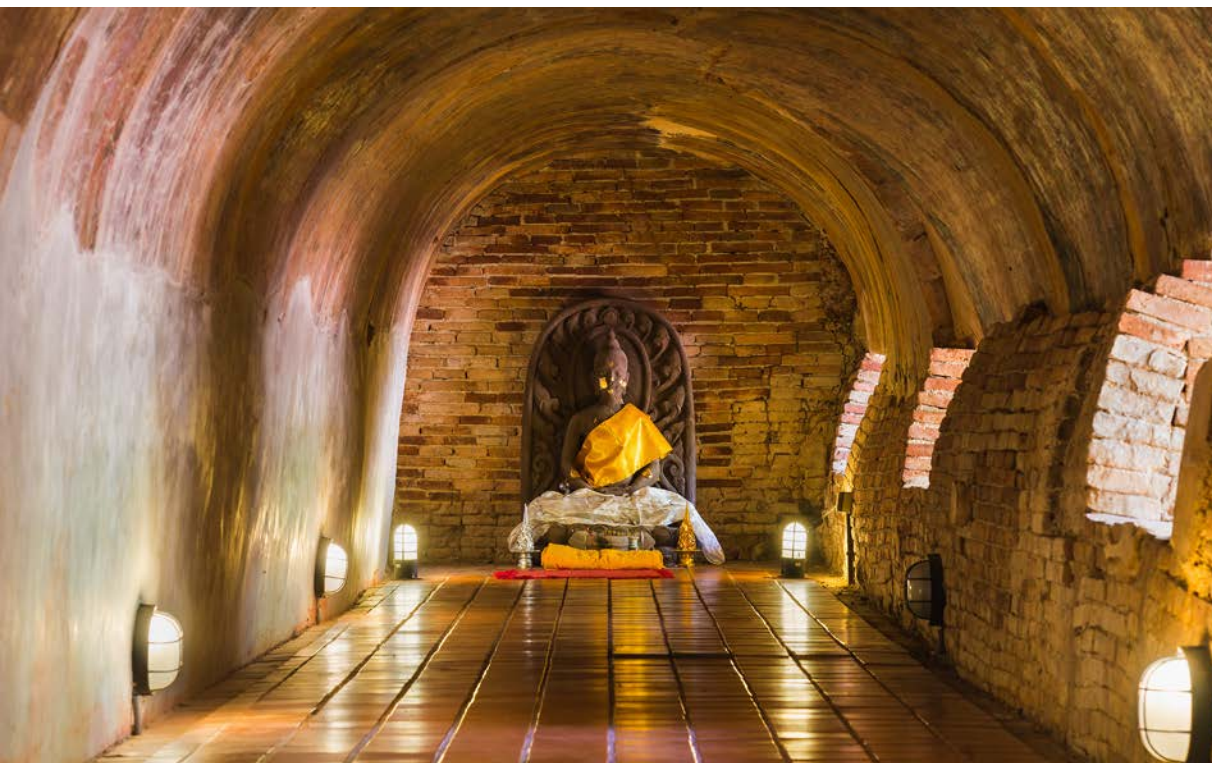

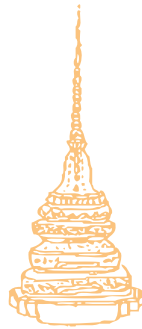

Wat Si Chum is a part of the Sukhothai Historical Park. The temple houses an ancient outdoor Buddha image called “Phra Achana”, with a faint smile showing mercy on his face. There was a legend telling the Buddha image could speak. The story began when King Naresuan the Great led an army to defeat the rebellion in Sawankhalok and they gathered at Wat Si Chum. Before the battle, the Thais fought among themselves and that made the army feel dispirited. The King, therefore, set the scene to boost morale of the military by having one soldier climb the hidden stairs behind the Buddha statue to encourage and cheer up the soldiers.

The Phra Nang Shrine, the Princess Goddess shrine, is widely respected by fishermen and the local people. Many come to pray for good luck and safety before going out to sea for fishing. Those who have their wishes granted often come back to offer phallic symbols (known as Palat Khik or Siwalueng in Thai) to the Goddess. This is why there are plenty of such objects piled up in front of the Shrine and out of the Cave. Stalagmites and stalactites can be found inside while in front of the Cave is a powdery sandy beach and crystal-clear water of the Andaman Sea.

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Nora is a folk performance of the South of Thailand. The performance has a long history and has become a crucial part of cultural heritage. The performance leaves the audience speechless with its exquisite costumes, fine instruments, and spellbinding movements. Aside from its entertainment purpose, “Nora Rong Khru” is a ritual performance to worship the spirits of the Nora masters and descendants, and includes culture, belief, and faith, which has been strictly handed down from generation to generation by the Southerners. The performance has become part of different ritual practices; such as, dancing after one’s wishes is fulfilled, Khrop Khru (a ritual practice conducted to bless new Nora performers), Yiap Sen (a birthmark treatment rite), etc. The Nora Rong Khru performance is conducted in several Southern provinces, including Trang, Phatthalung, Nakhon Si Thammarat and Songkhla. However, the Nora Rong Khru performed at Wat Tha Khae in Phatthalung is the most renowned event due to the great size of the performance itself, its exclusive ritual practices, and the belief that the Nora originated at Wat Tha Khae.

Wat Kham Chanot is a sacred place known for its supernatural powers. Many believe that asking for blessings and good fortune at this temple will get good results as they wish. That is why the site attracts large numbers of people from afar to come and pay respect. This place is full of many myths. It is believed to be the land of the Naga or large serpents, along with the folk tales of the floating jungle and the underwater city. The site is considered to be the only mysterious natural area in Thailand. If you enter the temple's grounds, you shouldn't miss to go to the holy well, a pond with



groundwater flowing out all the time. Locals believe this natural spring is a gateway to the mystic underwater world, the residence of Phaya Si Suttho Nakharat (the Naga Lord). It is a popular spot for tourists to bathe the Naga statue and spoon some water into a bottle to take back for worship and good luck. Aside from widespread belief in fortune, Wat Kham Chanot's geographical aspects look stunning as a unique floating island with evergreen Taraw palm (Chanot tree). Once you reach the island, you feel the coolness.

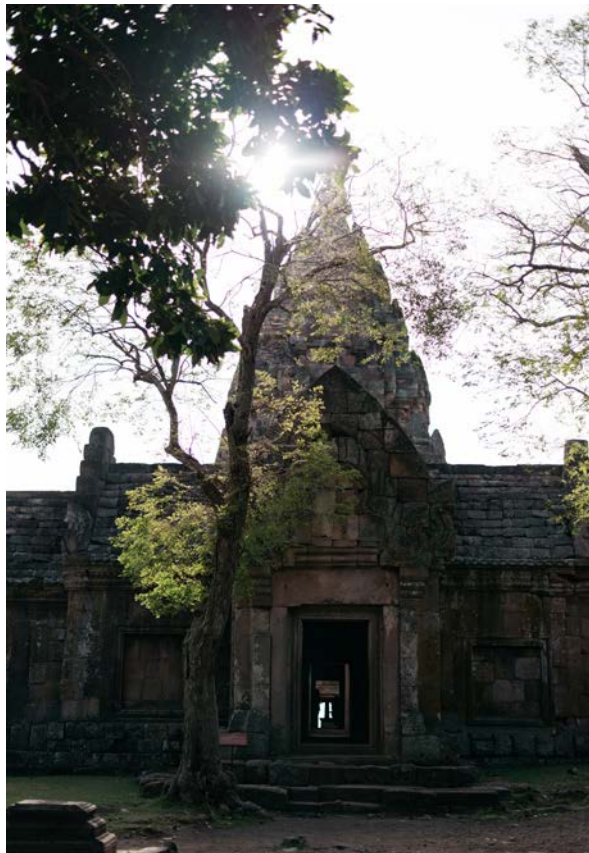

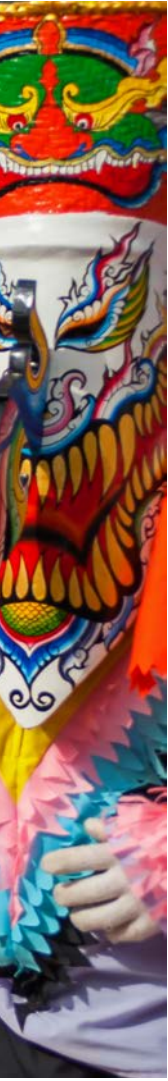

The “Naga Fireball Festival” is held for crowds of spectators who gather to watch the “Naga fireballs”, a remarkable phenomenon of mysterious red fireballs that burst from the bottom of the Mekong River and move skyward before disappearing. The fireball phenomenon occurs from sunset until midnight of the Buddhist Lent, usually on the full moon night of the eleventh lunar month every year. Both the Thai and Lao people will gather to witness this spectacular phenomenon together on both sides of the Mekong River. Local villagers on both sides of the River believe that the fireballs are generated by the Naga (the serpents) to commemorate the day that the Lord Buddha descended from the Tavatimsa Heaven to the earth. The best spots to observe the Naga fireballs include the International Buddhist Park and the banks of the Mekong River in Phon Phisai District and Ban Nong Kung.

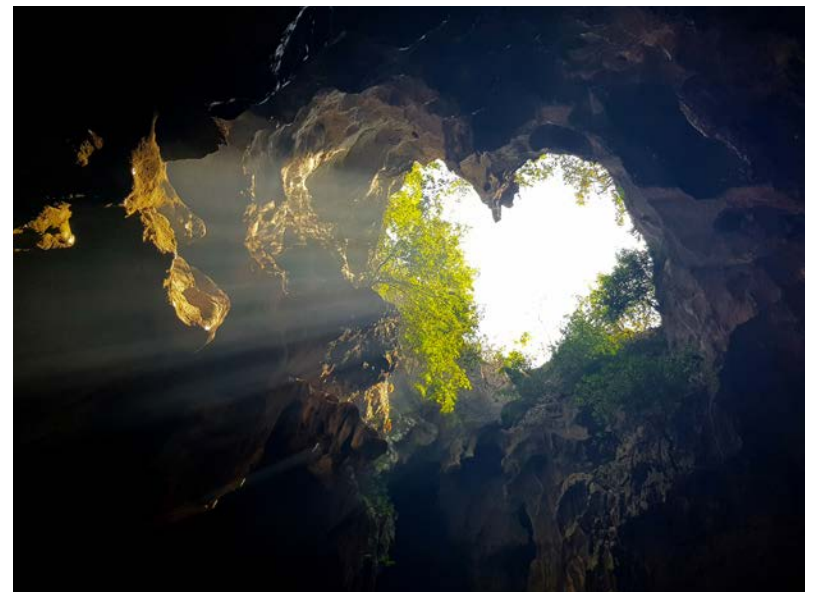

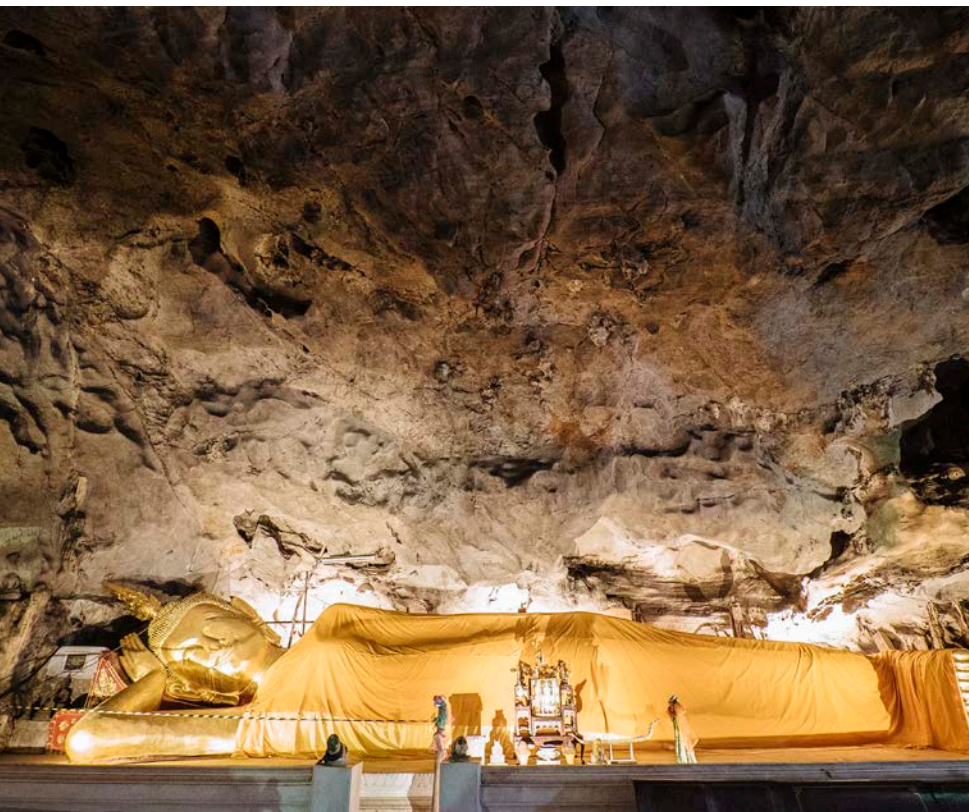
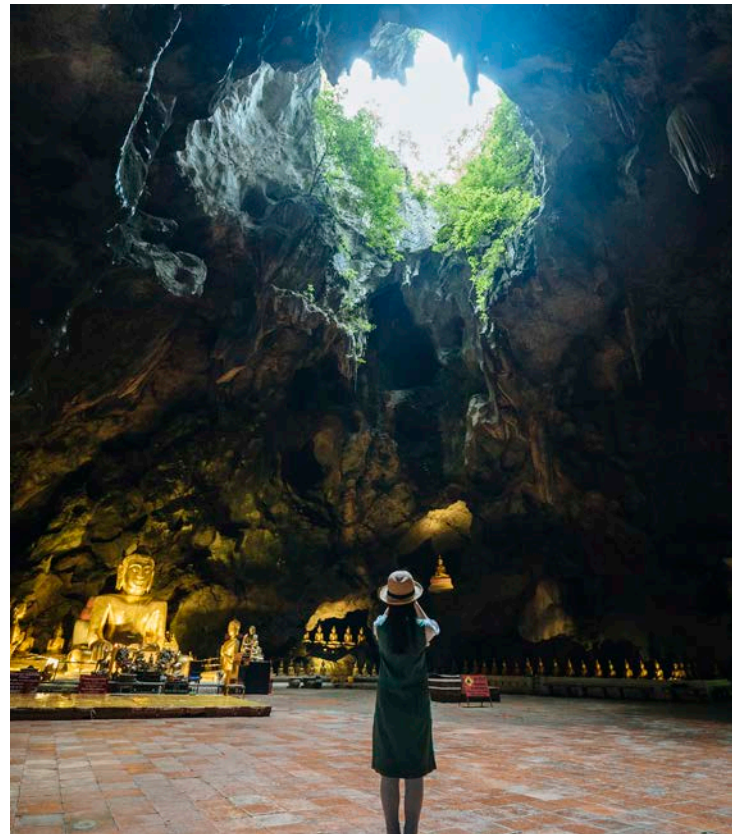

Tham Khao Luang, an important historical tourist attraction of Phetchaburi, is a large limestone cave with spectacular formations of glittering stalagmites and stalactites. Red-Water Lily- Dyed Fabric

Udon Thani



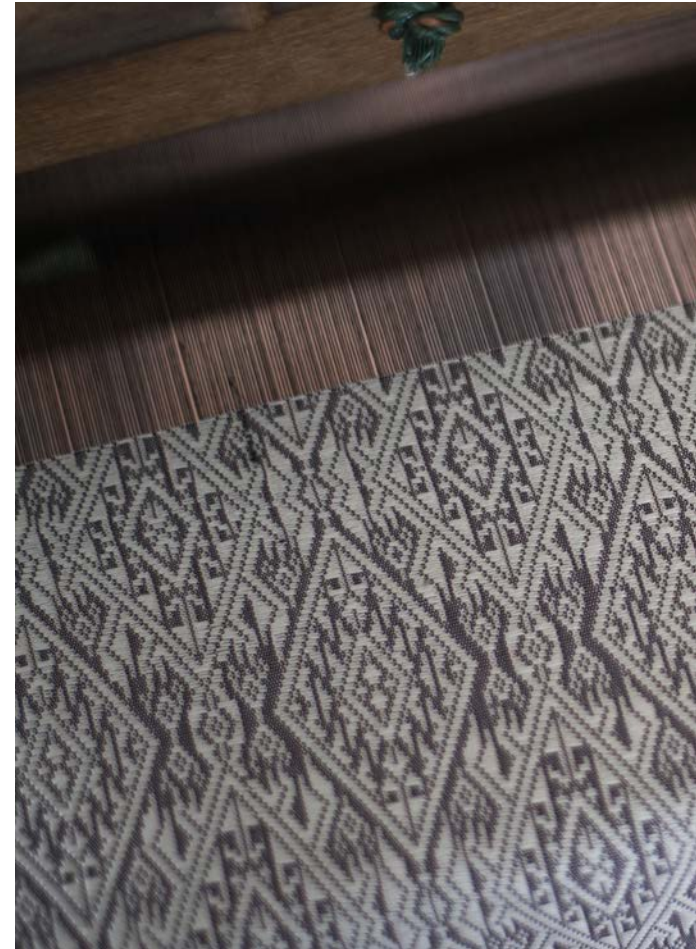
Red-water lily-dyed fabric is made by dyeing natural fibre with water lily flower and raw materials which are available in Udon Thani. A group of weavers in Ban Non Kok discovered a method of using water lily to dye natural fibre by chance in 2015. After the group noticed that the water lily flowers would yield a pink pigment when they were boiled, the group then applied that knowledge to their dyeing method. The process of using water lily flowers for dyeing natural fibre begins with boiling the flowers and stems for about 1 hour and then using the coloured water to dye cotton or silk fibers. The water lily flower usually gives a yellow-gold colour while the water lily stem yields a silver colour. The pink colour is derived from mixing the flower with fresh lime juice. The dried flower gives off a darker shade of colour than the fresh one. The entire dyeing process is done without chemicals. After the fibre is dyed, it will be woven in a traditional way on a loom. Even though patterns of the textiles have been modernised to meet new trends, the group still carefully preserves their traditional weaving pattern. During the weaving process, each dyed fibre is woven individually which adds a touch of uniqueness to every piece of textile. Khit Mai fabric with the “Sai Than Nak Chiang Ruang Yom Sai Bua Daeng” pattern has won the National Textile Award.

Pha Phu Akanee Buriram



“Pha Phu Akanee” is an orange brick coloured fabric that is made by dyeing natural fabric with soil from volcanic lava. The female groups of cotton and silk weavers in Ban Charoen Suk have brought lava soil from Khao Angkhan, one of the six extinct volcanoes in Buri Ram, to dye natural fibre. The lava soil dyeing process starts with mixing lava soil with water. The mixture is then filtered to remove the sediments. After that, the mixture is used to dye silk or cotton fibre. Finally, to make the colour stay, the fibre will be boiled in water mixed with Burmese rosewood bark. The creativity of using locally available materials to dye the fibre has made Pha Phu Akanee a distinctive product of Ban Charoen Suk. The village was consequently awarded OTOP Village Champion for its exclusive products. There is a wide range of products made from Pha Phu Akanee; such as, clothes, bags, wallets, shawls, hats, etc.

Ban Tha Sawang's Traditional Brocade Silk Surin



“Ban Tha Sawang’s brocade silk” is popularly known for its astounding weaving process. Its sophisticated and spectacular pattern requires the use of a loom attached with 1,419 heddles, unlike other woven patterns that only need 10 heddles for weaving. It also requires 4 artisans to work simultaneously during the weaving process. The first artisan handles the weaving, another two oversee lifting the heddles, and the last artisan, situated underneath the loom, takes charge of inserting a wooden stick into the loom. The ancient brocade silk weaving must be done on an elevated floor and also requires a work space with 2-3 metres depth underneath. This is to ensure that the lengthy handles hanging down from the loom are well organised. Due to its intricate weaving process, only 4-5 centimetres of fabric length can be woven each day. The spectacular brocade silk weaving process at Ban Tha Sawang is truly worthy to behold, even if you decide not to purchase any items from their shops.

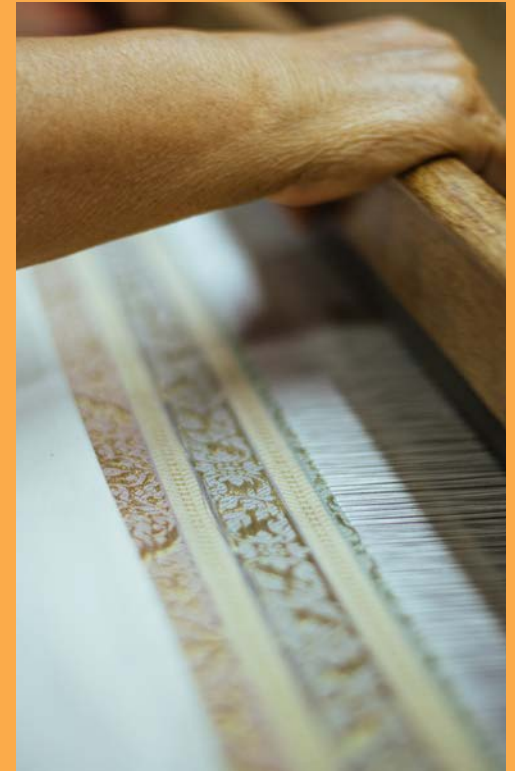
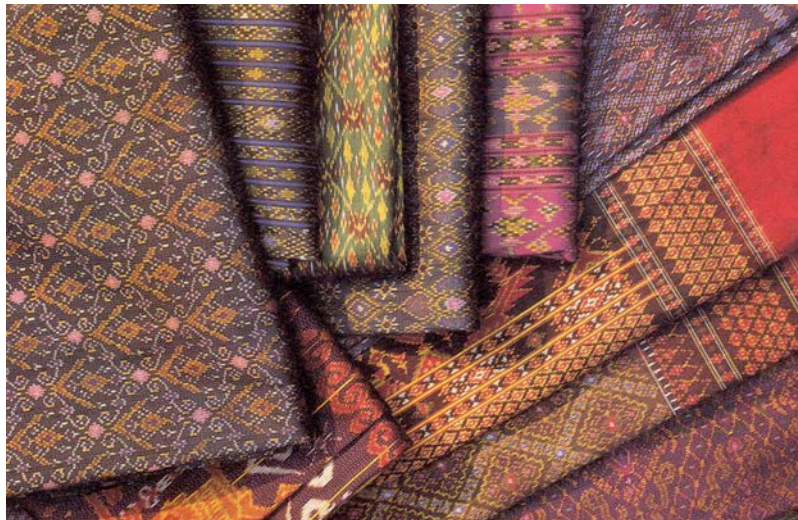
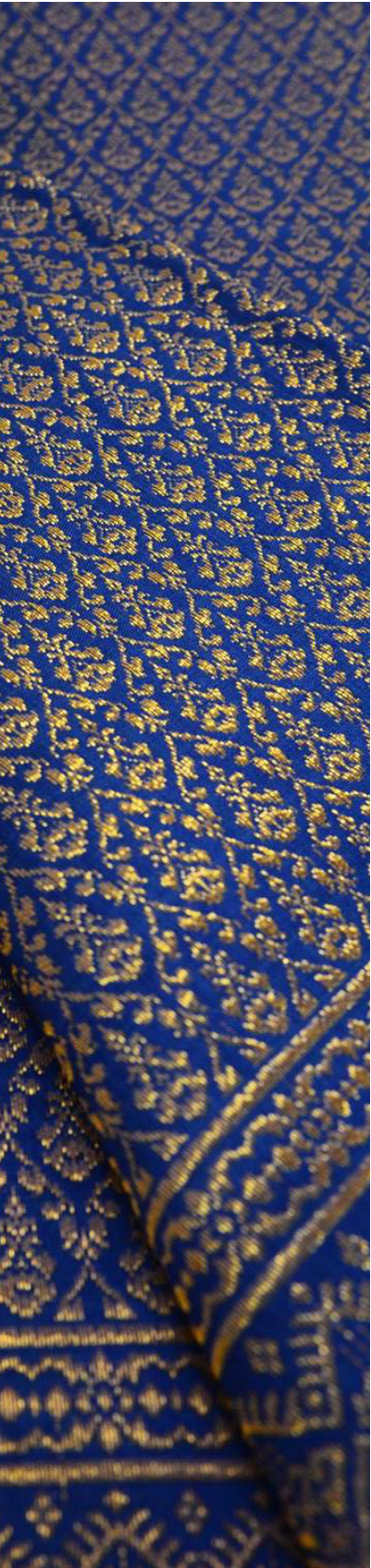

Phrae Wa Silk Kalasin



Phrae Wa Silk is very famous for its elaborate designs. It is also named the Queen of Thai silk. The fabric reflects the cultural identity of Phu Tai ethnic group. Phrae Wa refers to a piece of cloth at a size of around one wah of a weaver (or around one foot). It has been used as Sabai cloth, or breast cloth, which is worn in Buddhist related ceremonies. The designs of Phrae Wa fabric are created by the Koh and Luang (Chok and Khit) weaving techniques. Altogether, there are 60 designs that have been generated from the accumulated experiences and creativities of artisans. Kalasin locals consider Phrae Wa fabric as their precious heritage which must be passed down to the next generation. Based on Her Majesty the Queen's initiative to promote Phrae Wa weaving as a career for the villagers, the traditional length of cloth was later extended from one foot to one meter.

Even though the group has enhanced the pattern and color to be more beautiful, the group still preserves the traditional weaving method on looms. The group has creatively combined local wisdom with current market needs by using more than 100 colors of thread in the weaving process. Each Pha Kaow Mar has its own unique colors and pattern. Aside from Pha Kaow Mar fabric, you can also purchase different items made out of Pha Kaow Mar fabric including dresses, wallets, hats, cloth bags, and dolls for travel souvenirs.

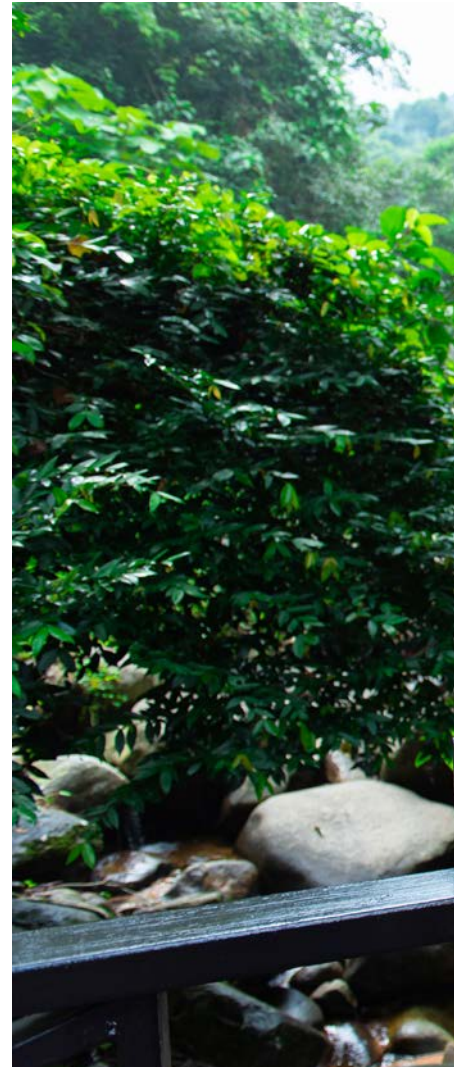
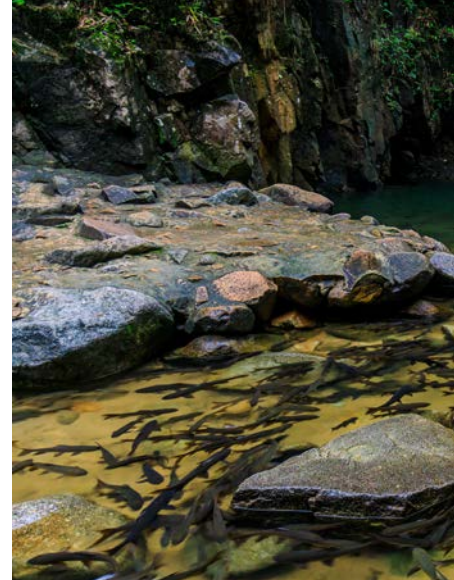


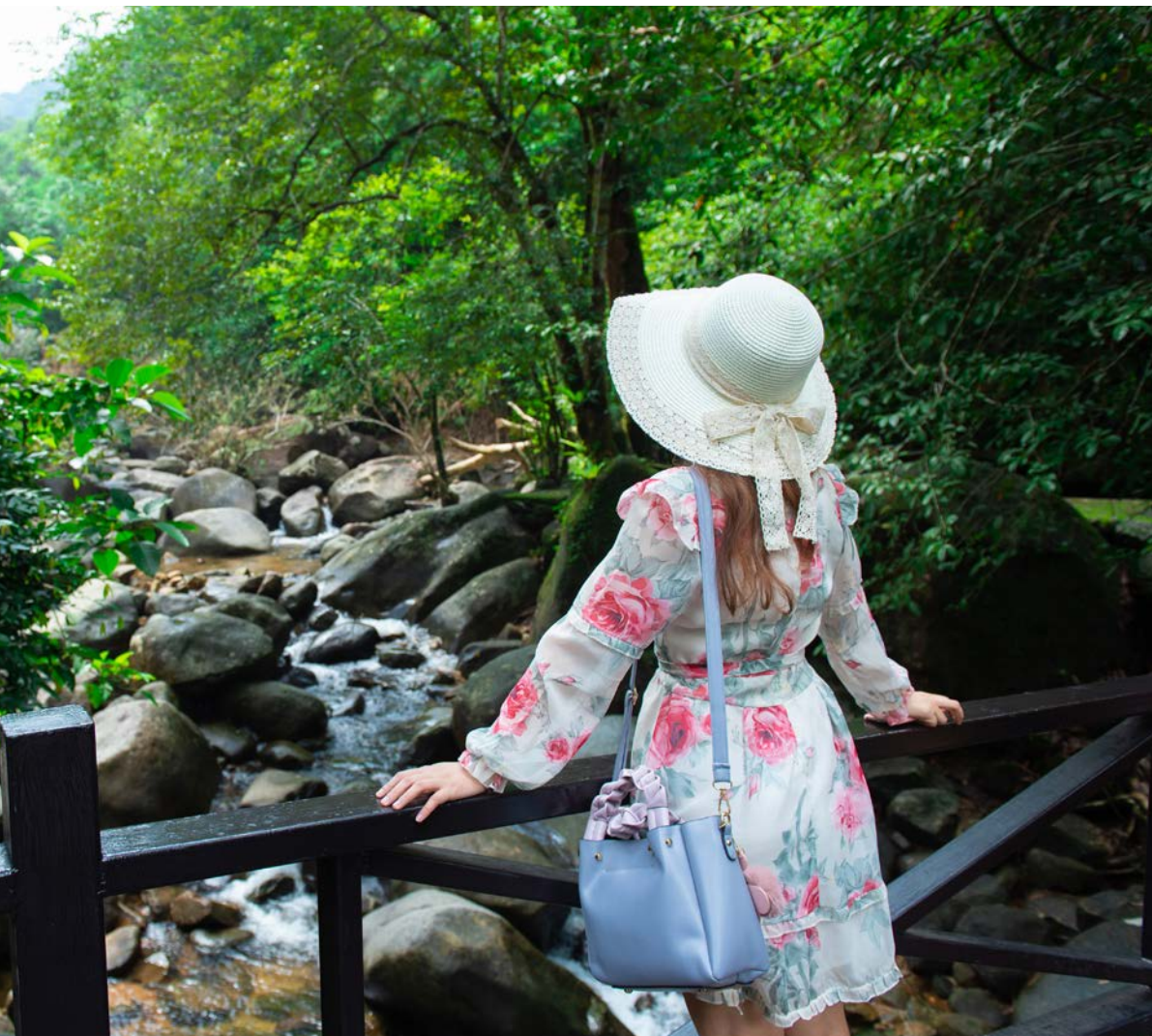
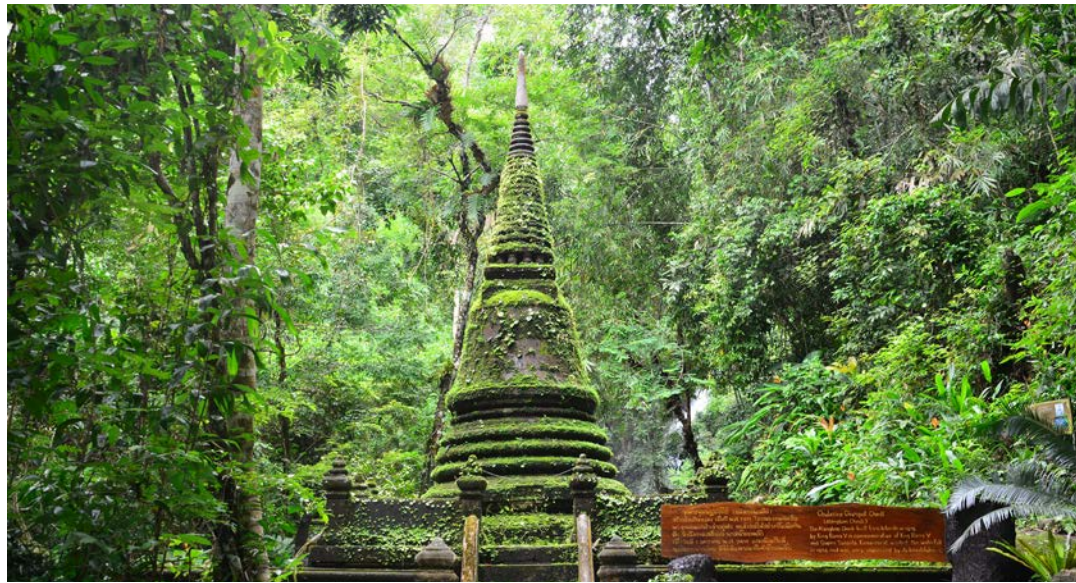
Namtok Phlio National Park Chanthaburi

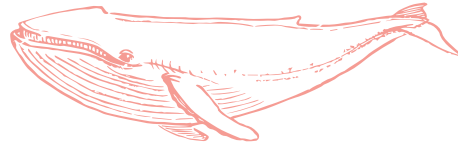

Three Whale Rock Bueng Kan



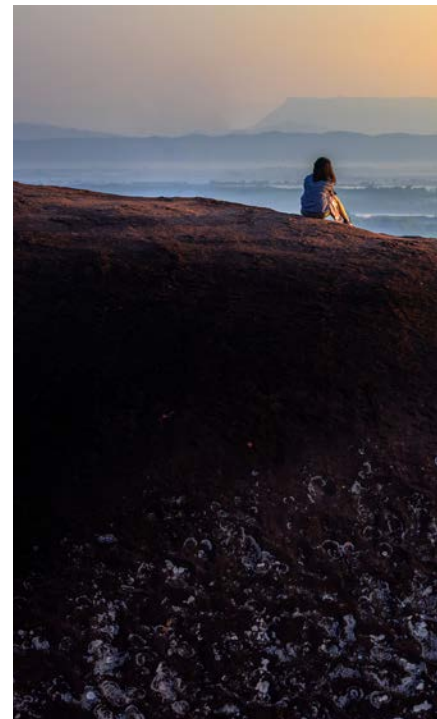
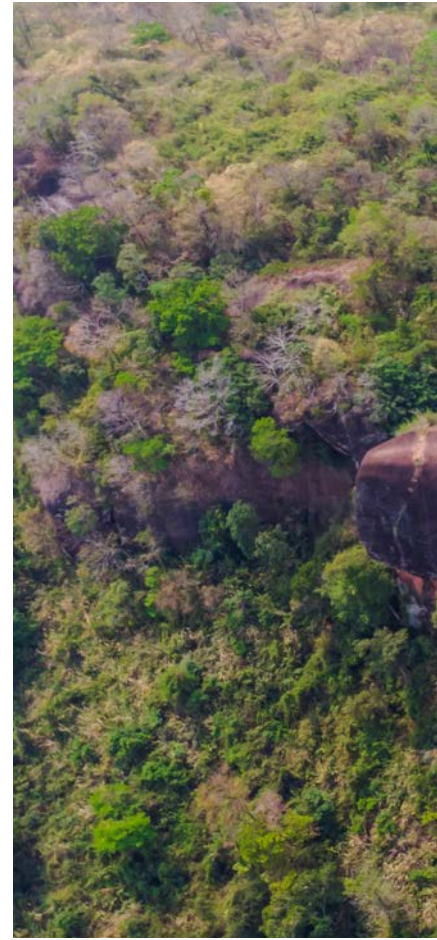
Three Whale Rock (or 'Hin Sam Wan' in Thai) are three gigantic rocks. Seen from a bird's eye view, the rocky formation looks like three whales; Dad, Mom and Son, so, it is called 'Three Whale Rock'. You can walk on the middle rock or Dad Whale, and the left rock or Mom Whale, but there is no trail to reach the smallest rock or Son Whale.
